


New independent agency to manage the occupation of the maritime area and to enforce the provisions of the new planning regime



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Update on Corporate Development Workstream

Recruitment:

- phased priority basis.
- Arrange formal secondment arrangements and secure recruitment licence for MARA.

Accommodation / Facilities:

- Suitable office space now identified, negotiate lease and secure by year end.
- Configure / design and fit-out premises.
- Put ancillary services and arrangements in place.

Finance:

Procure suitable Financial Management System and put in place for Establishment Day.

Information Communications Technology (ICT):

- Negotiate Service Level Agreement with the OGCIO including Comms Room and facilities fitout
- IT Unit: Secure and put in place the necessary resources, Hardware / Software and other IT Supports.



Continue staff recruitment to MARA Establishment Unit (Strategic Workforce Plan and Skills Needs Assessment) on



Operational Workstream - Progress

- Scoping out requirements for MAC and licence applications;
- Identifying resources required for consenting processes a mix of in-house expertise supported by external consultants the first of three tenders will be published shortly;
- Contributing to the SRMMI project single-point entry marine management system which is led by DHLGH;
- Engage with a range of stakeholders including Government Departments, planning authorities, agencies and representative groups;
- Working closely with Foreshore Unit in DHLGH developing plan for the transition;
- Engaging with similar consenting authorities in other jurisdictions best practice & lessons learned;





New consenting regime

Maritime Area Consent (MAC)


- Manages the relationship between the State and the Holder "right to occupy"
- Gateway into the planning system required in advance of applying for development permission
- Not environmental decision-making (MARA are not required to undertake screening for AA or EIA)
- No consultations

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- Not a lease
- MARA to determine a MAC application within 90 days
- Levy framework for different classes of MACs










MAC Assessment Criteria (schedule 5)

- Nature, scope and duration of the occupation
- Whether the usage is in the public interest?
- Location and spatial extent
- Consistent with NMPF & Ministerial Guidelines (section 7)
- Fit and proper person [schedule 2]
- Tax compliant
- Extent and nature of preparatory work undertaken
- The level of stakeholder engagement
- Any additional criteria specified in regulations







Development Permission


- Terrestrial planning permission regime extended to the entire maritime area, with marine specific considerations
- Planning and Development Act, 2000 amended to establish a framework for assessing development in the maritime area.
- Local authorities will examine applications within their own designated "nearshore area" extending a maximum of 3 nautical miles from the shore (*extension of LA functional area*)
- **An Bord Pleanála** will examine applications for:
 - developments wholly located in the outer "maritime area" offshore developments developments partly located in "maritime" and "nearshore" areas, or/and with land element

 - developments located across more than one LA "nearshore" area
 - developments of specified scale (as set out in Eighth Schedule of P&D Act) based on existing Strategic **Infrastructure Development process**





Maritime Area Consent (MAC) Process Development within CLA functional area – 'Nearshore'








Maritime Area Consent (MAC) Process An tÚdarás Rialála Limistéir Mhuirí - Outer Maritime Area (offshore), partly in nearshore & offshore, or Maritime Area Regulatory Authority located across more than one LA nearshore area

Development Permission is required for a usage in the maritime area

Enforcement: MARA - MAC & development permission

Submit application to ABP





- Dredging (not related to development)
- Marine environmental surveys for
 - the purposes of scientific discovery or research
 - the purposes of site investigation or in support of an application under Part XXI of PDA
- Installation of navigational markers/ moorings/ aids to navigation not undertaken by the Commissioners of Irish Lights
- Installation of non-permanent platforms or pontoons
- Depositing of any substance or object on or in the sea or seabed
- Removal of any substance or object from the sea or seabed
- Use of explosives
- The harvesting of seaweed




Maintenance of any cable, pipeline, oil, gas or carbon storage facility / structure not provided for under any other statutory approval

Any other activity that the Minister may determine (including events and leisure activities where required) – by regulations
